GALERIA MAYORAL JOSÉ GUERRERO Biography

José Guerrero (Granada, 1914 - Barcelona, December 24, 1991) was a Spanish artist, especially known for his abstract expressionist paintings, who spent much of his working life in USA. He is considered one of the most important Spanish painters of the second half of the 20th century.

In the 1940s he settled in Madrid. Later, he went to live in Paris, where he would be in contact with the European avant-garde. In 1949 he settled in New York, where he married Roxanne Pollock, American journalist.

In Manhattan he met artists like Jackson Pollock and Willem De Koonig, both related to action painting and with whom he presented exhibitions.

His work is present at the Guggenheim Museum in New York, the Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía and the Museo de Arte Abstracto Español in Cuenca. In Granada, the José Guerrero Centre opened in 2000.
